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








Microstates in the Global World

Nomothetic

Meaning 'law' or 'legislator' (from Greek *nomos*)

The study of individuals or a group, seen as an entity, with specific properties that set it apart from other groups


Idiographic

Meaning 'private' or 'personal' (from Greek *idios*)

The use of generalization rather than specific properties in the same context

Interpellation (Althusser 1971), the process by which individuals internalize the values and beliefs of the dominant ideology and perceive themselves as part of the existing social order.

Individuals are subjected to the dominant ideology through interpellation, which occurs via various cultural institutions shaping their beliefs and values, such as family, education, religion, and media.



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Adapting and Testing

- An example question in two versions demonstrates the difference:
- a) Do you prefer to operate on your own or in groups?
- b) At work, do you prefer to operate on your own or in groups?

- Questions were posed to test such two perspectives on similar occasions:
- a) What would you recommend to do in Monaco? (What is the common practice here?)
- b) How do you think it would be better to act in France/Italy/Europe? (What is the common practice there?)

The Sample

The quantitative segment of the study engaged 105 respondents.

The demographic composition of the sample was as follows:

Gender Distribution:

- Men constituted 60% of the sample.
- Women made up 40%.

Age Distribution:

- 8.6% were aged between 16 and 25 years.
- 18.1% fell in the 26-35 age bracket.
- 31.4% were aged 36-50.
- 25.7% were between the ages of 51 and 65.
- 16.2% were aged 66 and above.

Occupational Status:

- 55.2% were in salaried employment.
- 19% of the participants were retired.
- 6.7% were students, with the remaining percentage comprising various other statuses.

Residential Distribution:

The respondents were equitably distributed across different residential areas in Monaco, ensuring a diverse representation of local perspectives.

- 27.6% resided in Condamine.
- 16.2% lived in Fontvieille.
- Another 16.2% were from Moneghetti.
- 9.5% came from Saint Roman.
- The remaining percentage hailed from various other areas, ensuring a balanced representation.



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



































Comparison Stage



















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Practical Use

Our research explores how smaller countries are faced with the competing demands between maintaining their own idiographic value systems and their external nomothetic demands. Adopting a strategy at either extreme of this dilemma leads to a pathology. At one extreme, ignoring external changes leads to isolation and economic decline, decreasing population and eventually disappears when absorbed by their neighbours. (such as Sikkm by India 1975, Tibet by China in 1950's). Conversely, giving up their own values and accepting the nomothetic value systems of their neighbour means they are no longer a separate country (such as Hawaii in 1988 that become a US state).

We researched the cultural values systems and operational strategies of Monaco (not previously published) as our 'laboratory'. Our findings reveal its success in reconciling its idiographic values with the nomothetic systems of its neighbouring France and Italy and the wider European Union.
